Read Psalm 78:1-4. This psalm was probably written around the time of the ancient Israelite king David, and it would have been used in the worship of the Israelites who lived at that time. What does this Psalm say they will do? Why do you suppose that would be important

Read Psalm 78:5-8. How did you experience the knowledge of God being passed down to you from previous generations?

The words of this Psalm become a recounting of the story of Israel's relationship with God. Read Psalm 78:42-55. These verses recount God's act of salvation for Israel through the Exodus from Egypt. Do you "remember God's power" in saving you? What causes you to forget? What helps you remember?

Read Psalm 78:56-72. These verses rejoice that God has remembered his people and brought them through to better times. Even if you are in challenging times now, are there things for which you can give thanks to God?

Read Luke 24:13-32. Verse 27 says that Jesus explained how all the Old Testament scriptures were about him. If you've been a part of First Lutheran during this past year's journey in the Big God Story, how has this journey strengthened your relationship with Jesus?

Consider the five chapters in the Big God Story as we've learned them: Creation, Fall, Israel, Jesus, and New Creation. What do you sense God wants to write next in your story?
