CONNECT

If God has 1 main assignment for you, what might that be? If you were to write a “mission statement” for your life, what would it say?

LEARN & APPLY

1. The Lord gave Abraham a call. How does a person know their calling? Check these samples of Biblical calls: Exodus 3:1-12; 1 Samuel 3:1-10; Isaiah 6:1-8; Esther 4:13-16; and Matthew 4:18-22.
2. What are some common tasks that all Christians are called to, and what are some calls that a few individuals receive? Paul gives examples of gifts/callings in 1 Corinthians 12:7-11 and Romans 12:4-8.
3. Abraham’s call involved going. He had to leave his comfort zone. Why might God want us to change our normal routines? These verses have the Lord saying “go:” Isaiah 6:8; Matthew 10:5-7; Matthew 28:18-20; and Mark 16:6-7.
4. Abraham was 75 years old when he was called! Why does age not determine one’s call? Note the ages of these called believers: Moses, in Deuteronomy 34:7; Samuel, in 1 Samuel 3:1-4; David, in 1 Samuel 16:11-12.
5. Abraham would both be blessed and be a blessing to many. What are examples of how this double goodness happens? Who receives God’s goodness in these verses: Matthew 9:37-38; 2 Corinthians 9:10-12; and Galatians 6:6-10?
